

New - Check Out a Wireless Hotspot!!

Jacksonville Public Library now has a Wi-Fi mobile hotspot lending program to provide patrons with high-speed internet access. With this program, students can use the internet for help with homework and projects, and all patrons can have home or travel access to the library's digital resources (ebooks, audios, magazines, etc. through Camellia Net and Hoopla) as well as other internet sites, like Google, social media and streaming media sites.

Patrons must be at least 18, have an established library card in good standing and a government issued photo ID to check out a hotspot. A deposit may be required in some cases.


